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#### CAREER DEVELOPMENT IS EVERYONE'S BUSINESS





## 7-8 yrs Primary School







I can:

- -Pay attention for longer periods of time
- -See other people's point of view
- -Use my imagination
- -Follow rules
- -Recognise and identify my emotions



I am learning how to:

- -Play fair and cope with losing
- -Understand cause and effect, especially behaviour and consequences
- -Express myself more through language and creativity
- -Deal with frustration
- -Show initiative, planning and self-direction
- -Persist with tasks
- -Recognise that people have different points of view
- -Make decisions on my own and with others

Learning Opportunities at school. Help me by:

- -Encouraging team work and role playing
- -Giving me more responsibilities
- -Teaching me about other cultures and different ways of life
- -Talking with me about feelings, events and issues
- -Providing limits and boundaries and explaining how consequences are linked to behaviour
- -Intentionally building my critical thinking skills through problem solving and discussions about stories

#### WHAT THIS LOOKS LIKE IN THE SENIOR ROOM

### 9-12 yrs Primary School







I can:

- -Think logically
- -Pick up on the emotional cues of others
- -Recognise and consider other people's viewpoints
- -Participate in team activities
- -Consider the ethical issues of different contexts

I am learning how to:

- -Question and negotiate rules
- -Understand increasingly complex issues
- -Think in increasingly abstract ways and see problems from different perspectives
- -Bring ideas and information together in relevant ways
- -See opportunities to think or work in new ways

Learning Opportunities at school. Help me by:

- -Letting me take 'safe' risks
- -Giving me outlets for creativity and selfexpression
- -Talking with me about decisions
- -Give me more responsibility with higher expectations/accountab ility
- -Encouraging me to demonstrate creativity and understanding
- -Providing opportunities to meet people from different backgrounds
- -Work exposure to a variety of occupations (See National Skills Commission's Australian Jobs 2020 document)

In addition to being exposed to a variety of occupations, students in the Senior Room will have previous NPS students and community member come to school to discuss their high school experience, current occupation, and pathway options.
